Idaho Youngster Says Legislators Would Not Suffer With Them

The Precocity of Ada county rural school pupils was exemplified recently, according to Mrs. Russell, teacher of the district school at Kuna, by one of the small boys of her class. Mrs. Russell had been telling two or three of the youngsters about legislation enacted in Minnesota and other states, regulating the length of hotel sheets.

"I told them," she said, "that this was not so unreasonable as it might seem, because I could imagine nothing that would be more uncomfortable than for tall men to try to sleep in beds where the covering was too short. 'Just think,' I said, 'of some of our legislators, for instance, who were much over six feet. How do you suppose a legislator of that stature would be able to cover himself with sheets and blankets four feet long? He'd have to double up."

She was surprised and startled when one of the small boys of the class piped up and said: "Oh, they wouldn't be bothered much; you know papa says all men get crooked when they get into the legislature."
